- First close backed by sovereign development fund and other European institutional investors, signalling confidence in the strategy and sector
- Fund to invest primarily in European digital infrastructure, with a focus on data centres, communication towers and fibre networks
- Builds on Cordiant's established 'Buy, Build & Grow' strategy, focusing on applying operational improvements and follow-on growth capital to high-growth platforms

Luxembourg, October 22, 2025 – Cordiant Capital Inc. ("Cordiant" or "the Firm") has today announced a first close of over €200m of its Cordiant Digital Infrastructure Equity Fund ("Cordiant Digital II" or "the Fund"). The Fund, for institutional investors, has secured commitments from the European Investment Fund (supported by the European Union under the InvestEU Programme*), Ireland Strategic Investment Fund (ISIF) and Siemens Financial Services. This marks a significant milestone as Cordiant scales its digital infrastructure platform proposition.

Structured as an Article 8, Luxembourg domiciled fund, the Fund aligns with Cordiant's focus on providing capital solutions to mission-critical infrastructure sectors, which require substantial global expansion and that underpin our modern economic systems. Digital infrastructure exemplifies these characteristics and requires an estimated \$19 trillion of investment by 2040¹. The Fund will prioritise investments in high-growth businesses operating across data centres (including edge, colocation, and interconnect facilities), communication towers and fibre optic networks in Europe. This strategy enables the Fund to capitalise and support the substantial capital expenditure required in the digital infrastructure sector.

Cordiant Digital II builds on the Firm's established 'Buy, Build & Grow' strategy, targeting mid-sized companies and platforms with substantial expansion potential. This focus reflects Cordiant's ambitions in driving digital transformation and supporting platforms that foster enhanced connectivity, technological innovation, and economic resilience while aiming to improve

environmental and social performance across its portfolio, including integrating renewable energy, supporting sustainable urban technologies and reducing greenhouse gas emissions from assets such as data centres.

Earlier this year, CORD announced a major acquisition to strengthen a digital infrastructure portfolio company in Ireland, having also acquired stakes in two Belgian data centre providers in 2025.
